Ipswich towers open day

*St Margaret, St Matthew, St Mary le Tower,
St Stephen & St Nicholas*

Roy, Hugh, Judy and Heather Banyard joined Neville Whittell, our long time ringing friend from Suffolk, in spending the day ringing at five of the nine towers in Ipswich. Although St Mary le Tower is arguably the preminent 10 bell tower in the county, it was St Stephen which was the unique experience, the church having been converted into a tourist information centre and the ringing chamber accessed from within. The Corn Exchange in the town centre possesses one of the quirkiest statues in England, namely "Grandma", the famous cartoon strip character created by Carl Giles for the Daily Express. With her padlocked handbag and umbrella ready to be wielded, she is seen looking towards the building where the cartoonist had his office.
