REMEMBRANCE RINGING AT CHURCH OF ST. MICHAEL

Most of us will either have visited or at least walked by the historic church of St Michael at the Northgate in Oxford city centre but may not have been aware of the six bells housed in the Saxon tower.

The bells with their 12cwt tenor are set for chiming and tolling in what is known as an Ellacombe Ring so as not to compromise the structure of the tower. Oxford City Branch webmaster Andy Dunn recorded their chiming courtesy of David Barrington over Remembrance week. The recording has just been added to the Oxford City Branch website Towers page, alongside the comprehensive history on the church that was already listed.
