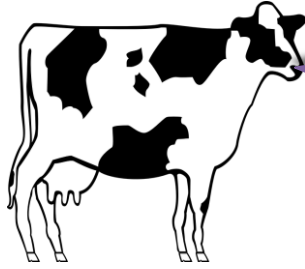

Back in the Day Monday 20th October 2008 Wing, Buckinghamshire - All Saints 28cwt

This was probably the most ambitious of our one tower Monday ambulations, not necessarily in terms of distance, but in that we picked a tower with a 28cwt tenor and hung anticlockwise for a practice session that consisted of London and Cambridge Surprise and Double Oxford Minor. Indeed there were some tired limbs all round at the end, but the bells actually belied their formidable weight and made for a satisfying evening. All Saints is one of the finest Saxon churches in the country with the unstintingly embellished interior containing numerous large memorials to the Dormer family. As could be expected, given the weight of the bells, the west tower is also of formidable proportions.
