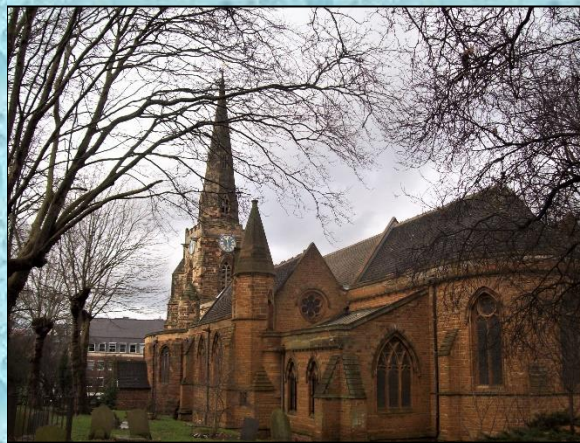


Back in the Day - Saturday 27th February 2010
