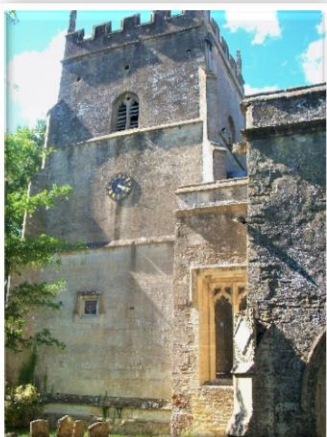

Enstone is now a large village that comprises five hamlets in addition to Church and Neat Enstone. The original Norman church (pictured left) was rebuilt in stages from the 12th to the 16th century. All of the bells have been cast by the Taylor family, four of which are from the Victorian era when they had a foundry in Oxford and the other two from the Loughborough foundry in the 20th century. Besides the fine sundial on the tower, there is a sublime three tier fountain next to the churchyard gate.
